Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs

According to Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) and the Maternal and Child Health Bureau (MCHB):

Children and youth with special health care needs (CYSHCN) are "those who have or are at increased risk for a chronic physical, developmental, behavioral, or emotional condition and who also require health and related services of a type or amount beyond that required by children generally."

Section 1: INTRODUCTION

- The goal of a Health Care Notebook is to provide a central location for important information regarding your child's special health care needs
- It is an organizational tool for families
- Serves as:
 - Medical History
 - Emergency Guide
 - > Reference Book
 - > Resource Guide



Other Benefits of HCN:

- Allows for easy access to important medical information
- Saves time
- Less stress
- Information is portable during an emergency
- Information is portable for doctors appointments or meetings
- Positions yourself for advocacy



- Medication Log








Section 3: CHILD'S MEDICAL HISTORY







 - >Let child decorate




