

Visiting with Loved Ones

Who Can Visit?

- 2 visitors, ages 12 or older, at the bedside at a time.
 - See below for exceptions.
- Medical masks are encouraged and will be provided.
- Individuals who are sick or believe they may have COVID may not visit.

When Can You Visit?

Visiting hours are between 8 am – 8 pm.

What are the Exceptions?

- Patients with COVID: Only 1 visitor at the bedside at a time. Visitors must wear Personal Protective Equipment. No visitors in the ED and procedure areas unless one of the exceptions is met.
- Critical Care Patients: 2 visitors, ages 18 or older, at the bedside at a time.
- Pediatric Patients: 4 visitors at the bedside at a time. Up to 2 parents/guardians may stay overnight depending on unit. Please check with unit leadership.
- NICU Patients: Only 1 parent/guardian may stay overnight.
- **OB Patients in Labor:** 2 visitors will be permitted at the bedside at a time, and no visitors under the age of 12 will be allowed.
- Behavioral Health Patients: Visiting hours from noon to 8 pm.
 Individuals must be 18 or older. Visitors ages 12 or older are permitted on 4.9000.
- Developmental Disabilities/Cognitive Impairment Patients:
 1 support person, no time limitations, as care team deems necessary.
- **End-of-Life Patients:** 2 individuals may visit at the same time.

Patients having surgery or a procedure in the Cardiac Cath Lab or Electrophysiology:

- 1 visitor may accompany patient through the pre-surgical process.
- The visitor may remain in a designated waiting room.
- If patient is admitted after surgery, visitation and exception guidelines will be followed.

Emergency Department and Observation Units:

- 1 visitor at a time with the patient, allowing for a second designated visitor to alternate with them, when volume and safety within the department permit. If waiting room is too busy, visitors will be asked to leave.
- If the patient is admitted into the hospital, but still in the ED waiting for a bed, hospital visitation and exception guidelines will be followed.

Pediatric Emergency Department:

 2 parents/guardians at a time with the patient, when volume and safety within the department permit.

Apheresis and Dialysis Units and Interventional Radiology:

- Visitors are not permitted due to space limitations.
- Visitation exception guidelines will still be followed.

Infusion Center:

1 visitor allowed at a time with the patient.
