The Department of Surgery at the University of Rochester School of Medicine and Dentistry is seeking to recruit a post-doctoral fellow for the Surgical Health Outcomes and Research Enterprise (SHORE). Successful candidates are expected to make significant contributions to scholarship in the field of surgical outcomes research, assist with grant preparation, and expand SHORE's research portfolio. Areas of interest may include but are not limited to: health services research and policy, quality of care assessment and improvement, health economics, decision analysis, and comparative effectiveness. All applicants must hold a doctoral degree (M.D. or PhD). Applicants must have an established record of publications in peer-reviewed journals and a demonstrated ability to work in a multidisciplinary setting, perform statistical analyses, and manage large datasets. This is a 2-year position. Successful candidates may be re-appointment on the faculty track.
