

UR Medicine Virology Laboratory Seasonal Respiratory Virus Report

Week ending 02 Dec 2017

Report highlights: For the week ending December 2, 2017, 352 respiratory samples were submitted for testing, a significant increase over the previous week. Influenza A cases has increased to 10 with Influenza B appearing in 1 case. RSV was the predominate respiratory virus this past week with 23 new cases. Rhinovirus/enterovirus was close by with 22 new cases. Coronavirus and metapneumovirus made a notable appearance with 9 cases each.

Results from the UR Medicine Virology lab for the previous 8 weeks are shown graphically as described below. The graphs display several components of testing, including changes in positive test results and testing volume with time, and positive test results divided into relevant age groups. The example below describes the different features of the graphs. Graphs will only be shown in the report when there is recent activity (2 or more cases in the current week, or >5 cases in a given week in the reporting period, an exception being made for influenza and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) which will be graphed when any are detected). Adenovirus reporting includes only respiratory sources.
