NEW YORK STATE CONSIDERING MENTHOL FLAVORING BAN

Approximately 1.7 million New York State residents smoke combustible tobacco products. Flavored commercial products such as menthol cigarettes make it easier to become addicted and harder to quit.

The team at the New York State Smokers' Quitline (Quitline) continues to closely monitor a proposed policy as part of the New York State 2024 Executive Budget that would ban the sale of all flavored commercial tobacco products, including menthol cigarettes. With 28,000 New York State residents dying every year from smoking-attributed causes and hundreds of thousands more suffering a variety of negative health effects, the proposed flavor ban could provide another impetus for those considering initiating a quit attempt.


