Coming off our first profitable year in over a decade, we knew this was a year where we had to prove our success was not a one-time fluke, but rather part of a sustainable trend. Thankfully, despite outside pressures and turmoil, we were able to do just that. For the first time in our history, we exceeded \$100 million in revenue from operations this fiscal year, and we believe we have positioned ourselves to sustain our performance well into the future. Thanks to strong performances from across our service lines, but most notably in Imaging, Interventional Radiology, ambulatory practices, and inpatient transfers, we exceeded our budget and year-over-year performance.

This success could not have been achieved without the over 600 employees who make Noyes Health the beacon that it is for healthcare in the community we serve. The commitment and excellence that our team exhibits every day has been the guiding constant that has spurred this growth and resulting performance, and we could not be more proud and grateful for their dedication.

As we look ahead into fiscal year 2026, we know there will be many new challenges ranging from a changing healthcare delivery landscape, reimbursement challenges at all levels, and increasing demand for our services. We have developed a five-year strategic plan that will position us to rise to those challenges and sustain our financial performance. We look to kick the new fiscal year off with a wealth of newly recruited providers joining our ranks at Noyes, bringing new services, procedures, and experience to our team and helping us to fulfill our goal of providing the highest quality healthcare close to home and in a place you trust. We are also proud that our quality score just moved to a 3-star (out of 5) rating, and we are anticipating moving to a 4-star rating next year. Only the top 15% of hospitals in New York State achieve this status.

So, as the quote above suggests, we have seen our fair share of storms over the last couple of years and we know there are some dark skies ahead, but I believe our best dancing lays yet ahead of us! We hope you enjoy the details within this Annual Report, and we anticipate even greater success in the years ahead.

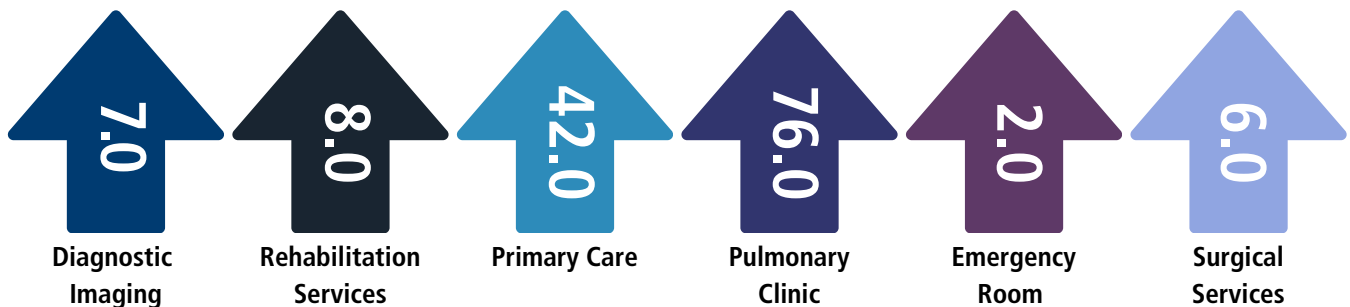
Finance

Noyes sees Strong Revenue Growth in Fiscal Year '25

In Fiscal Year 2025, Noyes experienced a strong 14% growth in patient service revenue, reflecting increased demand and expanded access to care. This growth was supported by notable increases in inpatient discharges, Ambulatory Surgery cases, Diagnostic Imaging, Primary Care, Interventional Radiology, Rehabilitation Services, and key specialties such as Cardiology, Respiratory Therapy, and Pain Management. Operating expenses rose by 10%, primarily driven by investments in wage, salary, and benefits programs, higher medical supply costs due to increased patient volume, and continued reliance on high-cost agency and locum staff. Despite these pressures, the hospital maintained a fiscally disciplined approach, focusing on business improvement plans and strategic investments. These efforts are designed to enhance service delivery while ensuring long-term financial sustainability. Our commitment remains centered on strengthening our Foundation to support future growth. This includes investing in our people, expanding health services for the community, and maintaining the infrastructure necessary to keep our facilities running efficiently. Through careful planning and responsible stewardship, Noyes is well-positioned to meet the evolving healthcare needs of our patients.

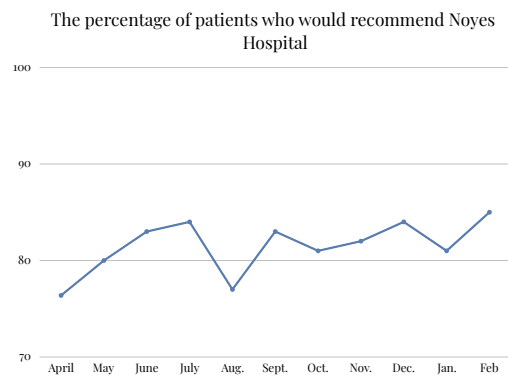

Interventional Pain Services

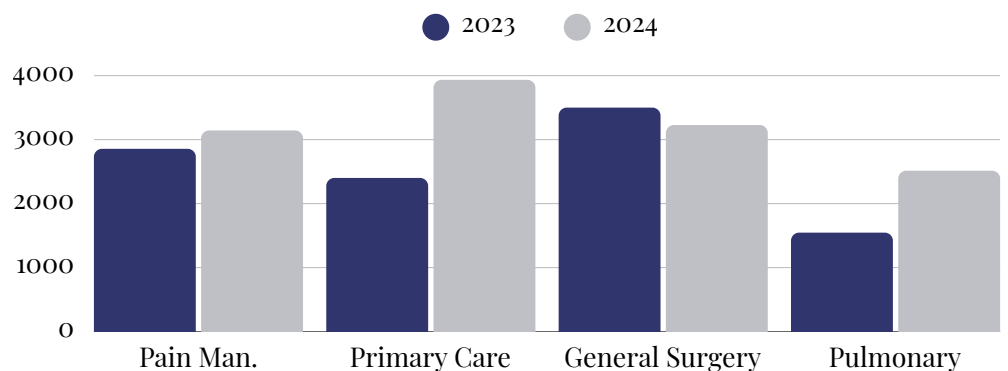

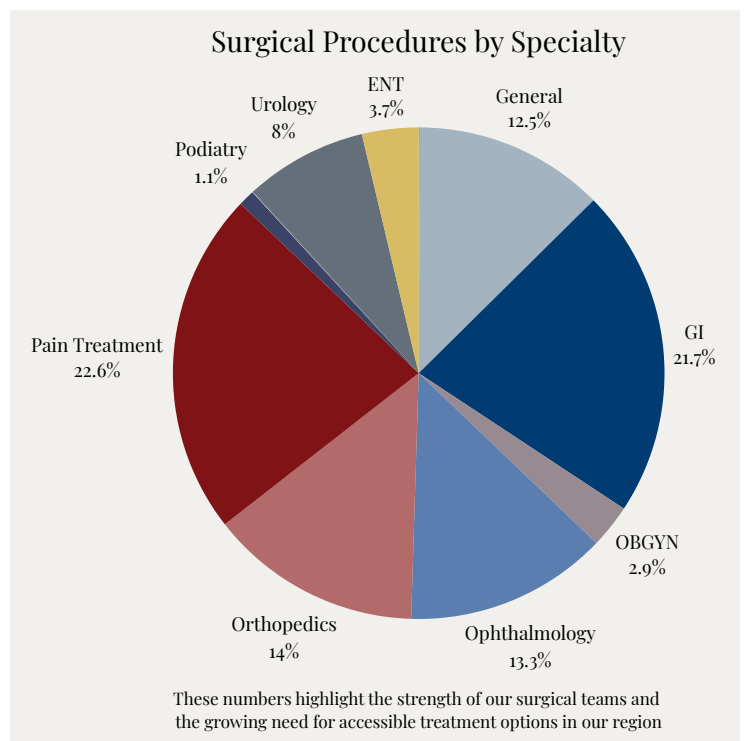
Welcoming New UR-OBGYNs: Elevating Gynecological Surgery

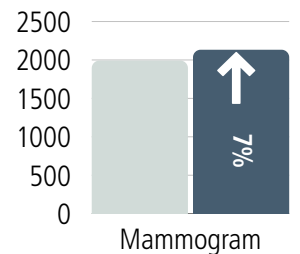
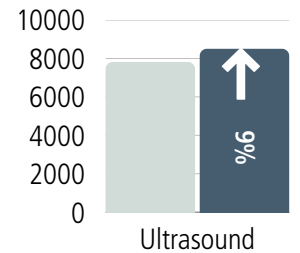
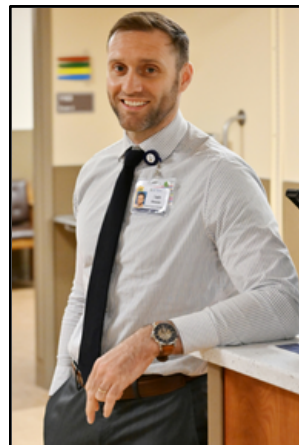
Renovated Imaging Suite Now Open

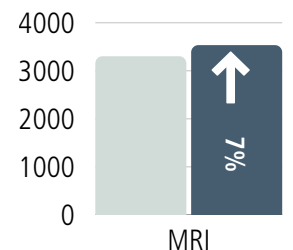
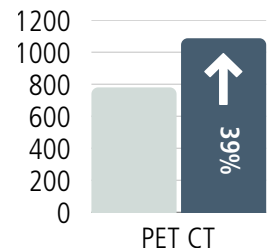

Leading with Care and Prevention

At the Noyes Birthing Center, we are proud to share that 98% of newborns receive their recommended vaccinations before discharge. This outstanding rate reflects our team's commitment to early preventive care and to supporting families in making informed, confident healthcare decisions for their babies. Our providers work closely with parents to ensure that every child gets the best possible start—combining clinical excellence with compassionate, individualized support. This high vaccination rate is a testament to the trust our families place in us and the dedication of our care team.

Birthing Center Updates & Milestones

Noyes Health's Birthing Center continues to grow and innovate. In the past year, we welcomed 244 births, with a breastfeeding initiation rate of 87.1% and a primary Cesarean section rate of just 10%.

Exciting improvements are underway, including renovations to enhance comfort and care. We've also introduced the JADA system to better manage postpartum hemorrhage and received a new transcutaneous bilirubinometer, donated by the Noyes Auxiliary, to help monitor jaundice in newborns.
