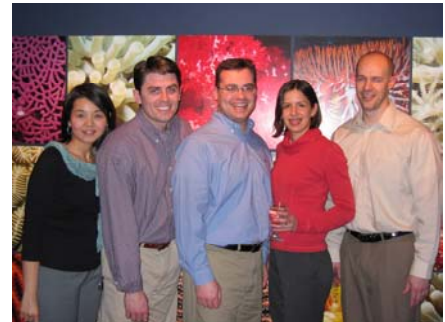

MEAW Course, Boston Massachusetts

Dr. Young Kim was a member of the first class under Dr. Subtelny's direction at Eastman Dental Dispensary 49 years ago. He also obtained a Master's Degree at the University of Rochester. During his practice in Boston, he developed a technique to diagnose and treat openbites non-surgically with a set of meticulously bent archwires – the multipleloop edgewise archwire (MEAW). He is the founder and president of the MEAW Foundation which consists of hundreds of members all over the

world. Dr. Kim announced that this year's meeting would be the final one taught by him so, Dr. Ed Sommers and members of last year's junior class were extremely fortunate to attend. The three-day session consisted of a didactic portion and a wire bending lab portion, which were both overwhelming and valuable. The residents were privileged to be acknowledged by Dr. Kim and it was an honor for Dr. Subtelny's last class to meet a member of his first class!
