Lainie Friedman Ross, MD, PhD About the Speaker

Dr. Lainie Friedman Ross is the Dean's Professor and Chair of the Department of Health Humanities and Bioethics, and Director of the Paul M Schyve MD Center for Bioethics at The University of Rochester School of Medicine and Dentistry. She also holds secondary appointments in pediatrics and philosophy at the University of Rochester.

Dr. Ross earned her AB from the School of Public and International Affairs at Princeton University (1982); an MD from the University of Pennsylvania Perelman School of Medicine (1986) and a PhD in Philosophy from Yale University (1996). She trained at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia and at Babies Hospital of Columbia University now the Morgan Stanley Children's Hospital of New York-Presbyterian.

Dr Ross' research portfolio focuses on ethical and policy issues in pediatrics, organ transplantation, genetics, and human subjects protections. She has published five books, over 200 articles in the peer-reviewed literature, and another 200 commentaries, editorials and invited manuscripts.
