E. Cowles Andrus Summer Fellowship Community Health Improvement Application

Summer 2020 Application Deadline: Monday, February 3, 2020 by 9:00 am EST Completed applications must be submitted electronically. The Center for Community Health & Prevention (<u>https://www.urmc.rochester.edu/community-health.aspx</u>) provides \$3,500 to UR medical students participating in community health projects that impact cardiovascular health through the Andrus Fellowship funding. One applicant will be funded and each interested student must submit their own application.

Application Requirements:

- 1. A completed Andrus Application Cover Sheet (see below).
- 2. Narrative No project proposal is needed. However, a narrative answering the two brief questions described below must be submitted with the cover sheet.
- 3. At least one brief informal letter of support from a mentor or supervisor, preferably faculty at the University of Rochester School of Medicine and Dentistry or community leaders. The letter should mention your previous work in community or public health if applicable.
 - a. A University of Rochester faculty mentor does not need to be identified. If selected for the fellowship, you will be paired with a mentor within the Center for Community Health & Prevention (CCHP) that will oversee your work during the fellowship.
- 4. Resume/Curriculum Vitae

Brief interviews will be conducted with all qualified applicants and additional questions about the project can be discussed at that time.

The E. Cowles Andrus Summer Fellowship for Community Health Improvement offers medical students, and occasionally exceptional public health master's students, the opportunity to plan and conduct projects in community health. The summer fellow will work within the CCHP full-time for eight weeks, independently, but under the collaborative supervision of a manager or director. Some Directors at CCHP may have ongoing projects that the summer fellow may work on, or if the summer fellow already has a project in mind, that option can be discussed as well. The summer fellow will be expected to work independently on a substantial and sustainable project mutually agreed upon by the student and the needs of the CCHP.

Applications will be evaluated based on demonstrated commitment to community, understanding of the Center for Community Health & Prevention, and the potential for contributing to a successful project.

Applications are due Monday, February 3, 2020 by 9:00 am EST.

Applications should be submitted in one pdf with required sections clearly labeled.
