

Moving Beyond Description in Social Media Analysis

An interdiscipinary team received an R01 from the National Institute of Health to advance research arising from academic community partnerships. Principal investigators



include Hua He, Naiji Lu, and Ann Marie White. Additional investigators include Jeffrey Bigham, Catherine Cerulli, Melanie Funchess, Henry Kautz, Vincent Silenzio, and Xin Tu.

This project will develop a new class of statistical and causal inference models for the effects of human interactions on health and health-related behaviors using network data from social media. In addition to transforming the potential of social network analysis, the new statistical approach will be applied to three research studies that integrate online social media information to understand the roles of human interaction on (a) disease spread, (b) mental health in a hard-to-reach population, and (c) presence and extent of "natural helping" in promoting wellness and reducing norms supporting violence in low-income urban neighborhoods.


